

Intermediate (Colored Belt)

The intermediate division is a division reserved for competitors who have trained for 6 or more consecutive months and/or hold the second belt rank or higher in their schools belt system and that is lower than Brown Belt or its equivalent (brown belt is defined as any color of belt or sash before the rank of black belt).

All competitors must enter only the divisions specified for by their sex, age, and time of training or rank which ever is greater.

A competitor can elect to go up a division of experience but not down in experience. The only time a competitor will not be allowed to go up a division of experience is when a minor competitor wishes to compete as an adult.

Once a competitor elects to go up a division in experience he/she may never go back down in level of experience. The competitor must from then on, enter all future tournaments at the rank of experience or age in which the competitor moved up.

Example: A competitor earns a brown belt at a school and has since competed in a tournament as a brown belt. After some time he changes schools and starts at the rank of white belt in the new school. If the student enters a tournament, he must compete as a brown belt because he has in the past competed as a brown belt.

If you enter a tournament and the tournament does not offer a division for your experience level or combines your division due to the 3 competitor rule and places you in a division of higher experience, you have not violated the division rule and may continue to compete in your regular division.
